ACT Today offers annual grants for ABA therapy as well as other therapeutic interventions for children with autism. Typical grants range between \$500 and \$1,000 per applicant; anyone may apply regardless of income level, but families with a household income of less than \$100,000 per year are given priority consideration. To apply for this grant, parents may download an application from ACT's website or call the foundation to request an application by mail.

The Parker Autism Foundation offers scholarships to children with autism and their families so that the children can participate in ABA therapy. Scholarships are available to any child who has been diagnosed with an Autistic Spectrum Disorder; funds may be used for ABA therapy sessions or materials at home or in school. Scholarship amounts depend on available funds and program costs. Interested parents may apply for the scholarship online.
